Responsibilities

- Participate in online and/or in-person activities related to teaching research projects for knowledge transfer
- Curriculum and programme development
- Development of teaching and learning materials
- Practicum supervision and programme and course management. Fieldwork may also be required.
- Familiar with the local mainstream school settings and experienced in the field of SEN support, especial in Autistic Spectrum Disorder (ASD), Attention Deficit/ Hyperactivity Disorder (AD/HD), and Mental Illness (MI)

Requirements

For Senior Lecturer

- Master’s degree in a relevant subject discipline, such as special education, educational psychology, counselling psychology, clinical psychology or psychology, plus at least three (3) cumulative years of full-time teaching experience related to special education at tertiary level or
- Three (3) cumulative years of teacher training experience in inclusive education or special education; or ten (10) cumulative years of teaching experience in supporting students with SEN in ordinary or special school setting

For Lecturer

- Master's degree in a relevant subject discipline, such as special education, educational psychology, counselling psychology, clinical psychology, or psychology, plus at least two (2) years of work experience in supporting students with special educational needs in ordinary primary or secondary schools.

Applicants should

- Preferably demonstrate ability in the use of IT in SEN support and provide proven evidence of quality teaching and/or
- Successful record of relevant professional/clinical experience, at primary/ secondary and or tertiary level
- Working Experience in child and adolescent psychiatry, child and adolescent mental health would be an advantage

- Significant contributions to in-school curriculum development, teacher development and/or clinical support would be preferable
- Frontline experience in e-learning and e-teaching will be an advantage

The appointment is contract-based and renewable upon mutual agreement.
